Pursuant to subsection 9(2) of the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5, Council amended the condition of non-development use made pursuant to section 2 of the Land Identification Regulations (EC606/95) in respect of approximately forty-seven decimal five (47.5) acres of land, being Provincial Property No. 818344 located in Lot 19, Prince County, Prince Edward Island and currently owned by Robert Gavin and Fay Gavin, both of Summerside, Prince Edward Island.

Council noted that this amendment will enable subdivision of a parcel of land of approximately five decimal two one (5.21) acres, and determined that following subdivision, identification for non-development use shall continue to apply to the new parcel and to the remaining land.
