Having under consideration the recommendation of Treasury Board (reference Minute TB#264/21 of July 14, 2021), pursuant to subsection 32(1) of the *Financial Administration Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. F-9 Council agreed to guarantee payment of a term loan by the Prince Edward Island Grain Elevators (hereinafter referred to as "the borrower") in an amount not exceeding one million, nine hundred thousand dollars (\$1,900,000.00) (hereinafter referred to as the "guaranteed indebtedness") together with interest thereon at the rate of prime minus zero decimal two five (0.25%) percent to the Bank of Nova Scotia of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island (hereinafter referred to as "the lender"), from the 27th day of July, 2021 through to and including 1700 hours on the 31st day of July, 2022, the said guarantee to be subject to and conditional upon the following terms and conditions:
