

Family Housing Program

The Family Housing Program provides quality rental housing units for Island families and individuals with low incomes, poor housing conditions or other special circumstances that create a need for assistance and who may not otherwise be able to obtain adequate housing.

In recognition of these needs, the federal and provincial governments provide funding for building and maintaining Family Housing projects.

Where Are Family Housing Projects Located?

Family Housing units are located in nine Island communities across the province:

You may also be able receive a rent supplement benefit with a private landlord in any community.

How is the Program Administered?

Family housing units are managed by nine local housing boards whose members are local residents appointed by government. These boards may employ a Project Manager who is responsible for day-today matters such as maintenance, rent collection, and administration.

How Are Tenants Selected?

Tenants are selected based on need. A rating system is used to determine which applicants have the greatest need. When assessing need, staff consider income, health, age, and present housing.

The local housing boards select tenants based on the availability of a vacant unit appropriate to meet a family's need.

What Is Provided In The Units?

One, two, three and four bedroom units are available in most locations. Units are equipped with a stove and a refrigerator and are fully serviced with heat, water and electricity.

In most units, the tenant is directly responsible for paying for heat and utilities; however, in some cases, a standard adjustment is made in the monthly rental payment to assist with heating costs. Tenants must furnish their own apartments, and are expected to maintain their own tenant's insurance coverage.

What Rent Is Charged?

Rent is based on total household income and is calculated using a rent-toincome scale. Most families pay 25 per cent of their income for rent.

How To Apply?

Once your application is received, a housing staff member will contact you to schedule an in-home interview with you.
